To maximise student progress:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • support and challenge progress through appropriate intervention across all years, effective use and analysis of data, for robust target-setting with students and staff • continue to develop effective data tracking and reporting systems. • continue to develop and extend opportunities for an exciting and engaging curriculum to promote student achievement and to meet their needs and interests

To maintain consistent high quality Teaching and Learning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • embed further use of formative feedback to support student progress • embed further literacy and numeracy across the curriculum • nurture a staff culture of sharing pedagogy through teaching and learning groups • extend opportunities for independent learning

To maintain high quality care, guidance and support:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • continue to monitor, challenge and support student progress across the curriculum • continue improvements in attendance and punctuality particularly of all students • work with all stakeholders including parents, staff, other providers and wider children’s services to meet student additional needs • continue to review and monitor processes and systems that underpin student support and College equality objectives.

To promote high quality teaching and distributive leadership through College appraisal and Continuing Professional Development provision for all staff:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • monitor performance effectively; intervene promptly, where necessary, to provide challenge and support; share good practice at all levels • support leaders and managers in their focus on maximising standards through rigorous quality assurance of team, staff and student performance • continue to nurture and support staff potential for growth; recognise and grow future leaders.

To investigate and make the most of opportunities and resources to achieve “best value” and ensure the best outcomes for students including managing financial resources:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • oversee the final stages of the BSF Programme and pursue funding streams which may benefit the learners at Sir Jonathan North Community College.
