FIRST PRIZE IN CHEMISTRY COMPETITION

The Midlands Salters' Festival of Chemistry took place at Leicester University on Thursday 8 June.



The purpose of the Festival is to:

- Excite pupils by doing practical chemistry
- Give pupils responsibility to carry out investigations 'like a real Chemist'
- Encourage team working and independent problem-solving skills.

We entered a group of four Year 8 students – **Husna Dawson 8.4, Phoebe Kitchener 8.3, Naomi Lindsey 8.6 and Amy Lowe 8.6.**

The students had to complete two tasks as a team in the university chemistry labs. The first task was a CSI investigation set by the Salters' Institute and the second task was based on density which was set by the Chemistry Department at the University.

After completing the tasks, students were entertained by an exciting Chemistry Show whilst the judges deliberated.

The Sir Jonathan North team won first prize out of 17 teams from the Midlands in the Salters' CSI investigation. They were commended for their excellent investigative skills, fabulous explanations and tremendous team work.

REGIONAL FINAL OF FRENCH AND SPANISH TRANSLATION BEE

In the East Midlands, more than 8000 students studying French, Spanish and German started the Year 8 and 9 Translation Bee competition this year. On Wednesday 14 June, the final 83 students competed for a place in the national final. Year 8 students **Grace Newton, Hanna Anwar-Khan, Zaynab Dadhiwala and Nesrin Ayoub** represented Sir Jonathan North in the semi-finals for French and Spanish and did us proud.

Zaynab and Nesrin are two of the five regional finalists who have secured a place to the national finals for French, which is a fantastic achievement. Their performances were particularly remarkable as they were competing against Year 9 students. Zaynab and Nesrin will be representing the College in the national final of the competition, held in Cambridge next month.

The competition, which is sponsored by the European Commission, involves Year 8 and Year 9 students competing to correctly translate the most sentences in French, Spanish or German in just 60 seconds, using the three tenses.

We are looking forward to seeing the girls compete again in Cambridge on 3 July and wish them good luck.

GCSE GEOGRAPHY EDALE TRIP

On Monday 12 June 2017 a group of GCSE Geography students went to Edale in the heart of the Derbyshire Peak District to complete their physical geography fieldwork. The students learnt about the importance of the National Park and completed an in-depth study of river landforms and processes at Grindsbrook and Golden Clough. It was a very 'hands on' trip that saw students in the river in their wellingtons measuring the gradient, channel width, depth, velocity and bedload dimensions in each section of the river. This involved students throwing different shaped dog biscuits into the river and using a stop watch to see how fast it took them to reach a point 10 metres down the river. There would be lots of happy ducks (and dogs) about after our trip who would enjoy eating them! Students also used a gun clinometer to measure the gradient of the river and an impellor to measure velocity. We had great day and all of the students had a trip in which they learnt new skills and brought geography to life by seeing a waterfall, V shaped valley and a meander.
